Take opportunities throughout the school year to discuss with your child how they see themselves as learners. In reviewing 'My Learner ID' with your child, remember:

- At all times, the child's view must be treated with utmost respect.
- Remember it is your child's perspective and their understanding of themselves that is important. You are not looking for responses you might favour as a parent.
- ✓ Offer total non-judgmental listening.
- ✓ Offer genuine acceptance and unconditional positive regard.
- Never criticize any response your child offers.
 Remember, it is their worldview that matters.
- ✓ Ask open-ended questions.
- ✓ Avoid questions that require a 'Yes' or 'No'
- It is best and enough simply to listen to your child.
- ✓ If offering an observation, only offer an observation on indisputable facts e.g. 'I notice you have included a happy face here..'
